FINAL PROJECT:

Essay on the positive and negative effects of globalization today.

* **Requirements 1, 2 & 3 are necessary to deliver the final project.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS

- **Individual activities:**

Individual activities have to be delivered each week; besides, the student has to participate in class. In some cases, these activities can be: homework, class activities (if not attending the activity will not be delivered later) or tests. The student has to accumulate 10 points of 15 to be able to deliver final project. If the activity is done as requested the value is 1 point, if not is zero.

- **Requirements for the course:**

* Student can have 4 absences maximum (corresponding period) to present each exam = 8 absences throughout the semester.

* The student must meet 70% of the activities undertaken during the course, otherwise the student is not entitled to have a second chance and if not meet the 70 qualifying automatically switches to third opportunity.

* Academic dishonesty (copy) into tasks and exam is automatically a zero; student must be penalized with 10 points in the final

average; at the second attempt it is a failure of the course.

* Student has to sign final grade, if not, the grade will appear in the system anyway.

* Those students who do not show proper behavior in the classroom will be entitled to 10 points penalty.
